School Uniform Policy

The school has a uniform as we feel it gives the children a sense of belonging and pride. We like our children to be clean and tidy at all times.

Light grey sweatshirts or sweatcardis embroidered with the school logo are worn. These are ordered online at www.schooltrends.co.uk in sizes 22" to 36". Under the sweatshirt a green polo T-shirt is worn. These are also ordered from School Trends in sizes 22" to 36". Boys wear grey trousers and girls wear grey skirts, pinafore dresses or trousers. Trousers must be of smart appearance and of a recognised school style. Any shade of grey is acceptable.

In the Summer boys and girls may wear shorts and girls may wear a green and white checked Summer dress. Girls can either wear the school sweatshirt over their dress or a school sweatcardi. Alternative cardigans are not permitted.

Girls socks are grey or white and tights are grey or green. Boys socks are black or grey. Black shoes are to be worn. Trainers and boots are not permitted.

We have a school fleece, reversible waterproof coat and a bobble hat, all of which are available from School Trends but are not compulsory uniform items.

For P.E. all children wear navy or black shorts, of a regular P.E. style, and T-shirts embroidered with the school logo. The T-shirts are ordered from School Trends and are available in sizes 22" to 36". Pumps or trainers are worn.

For outdoor sessions dark blue or black jogging bottoms, sweatshirt or track suit top are worn, together with the blue school P.E. T-shirt and trainers. Children should bring their kit into school in a named bag and leave it in school during the term. P.E. bags in house colours are available to order via the school secretary.

Plain ear studs and watches may be worn. No other jewellery is permitted. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost or damaged items. Jewellery must be removed or covered for P.E. and games for Health and Safety reasons. Make-up is not permitted. Mobile 'phones must not be brought into school. Hair accessories should be in either school or neutral colours. Tramlines cut into the hair are not permitted.

Being a small school with limited space it is essential that large bags are not brought to school. We have our own school book-bag, available from the secretary, in which the children can transport their daily needs, however, this is not compulsory.
